I speak for the entire staff at Mount Bethel when I say thank you for all your support and everything this amazing community does for our school!





Reading: REAP & Acadience

The ten-day REAP (Reading is Essential for all People) training was the **best professional development I've ever had!** By delving into the systematic and explicit teaching of phonics principles, we gained a deeper understanding of how language works, which **allows us to support struggling readers and advanced learners alike better.** Every training session provided us with multisensory techniques and instructional strategies that could be immediately implemented with our students, equipping us with both the knowledge and actionable steps to support students. Our students have made improvements in decoding, fluency, vocabulary, and overall reading comprehension thanks to the REAP training!

Acadience Reading is a screening and progress monitoring assessment that measures the acquisition of early literacy skills. Having access to this type of assessment tool allows Mount Bethel teachers to better understand and monitor their student's reading progress. It helps to pinpoint both strengths and weaknesses in early reading skills and streamlines grade level data discussions as well promote vertical alignment within as school. Acadience Reading directly aligns with the Foundation funded structured literacy training our staff has participated in through Reading is Essential for All People (REAP) and is the essential link to ensure all Mount Bethel students become strong readers! Learning Commons Renovation

The MBES Foundation provides opportunities for staff to invest in experiences that benefit all children. Although the school is blessed with a large space for the Learning Commons, the existing layout does not lend itself to the highest and best use of the space. Our vision is to create a welcome, inviting, and safe place for all staff and students to enjoy throughout the school day. We are in the process of replacing the wall shelving to open up the left side (looking from the door) so that worktables, chairs, and soft seating can be added to meet the needs of small collaborative groups, individual study, and individual reading areas. Soft seating will be added throughout the room so that young students have an area to call their own and the older students have more mature but kid friendly seating. If not for the Foundation, this vision would have no chance of materializing. We are so grateful.
